

Have you been affected by Intimate Partner Violence?

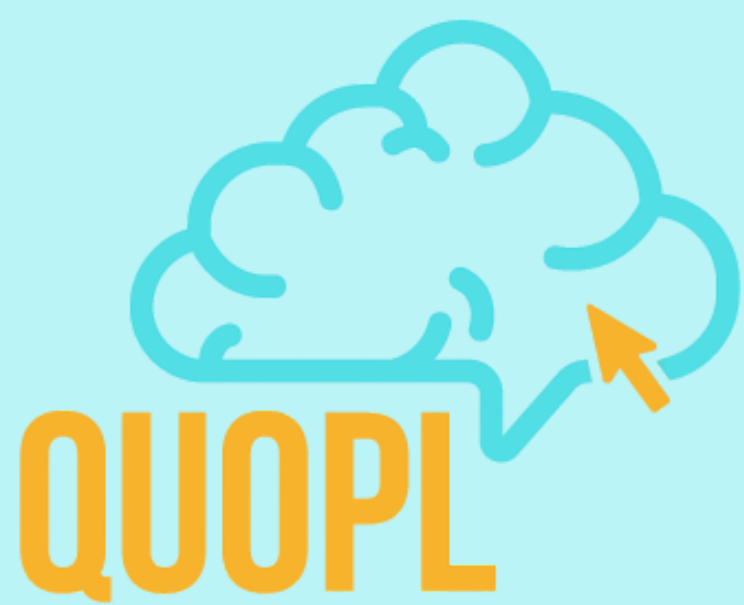
Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) refers to any harmful behavior or abuse that occurs within an intimate relationship. This can include physical violence, emotional or psychological abuse, sexual abuse, or threatening/controlling behaviours.

As part of a research study through Queen's University and Waypoint Centre for Mental Health Care, we will interview participants affected by IPV (in-person or virtual) to explore their care and service experiences.

If you are ages 18 years and above, live in or close to the Simcoe/Muskoka area (Ontario, Canada), and have experienced and/or perpetrated IPV within the past two years (in a romantic relationship that lasted at least three months), we invite you to share your experiences in this study.
